What are you thankful for today?

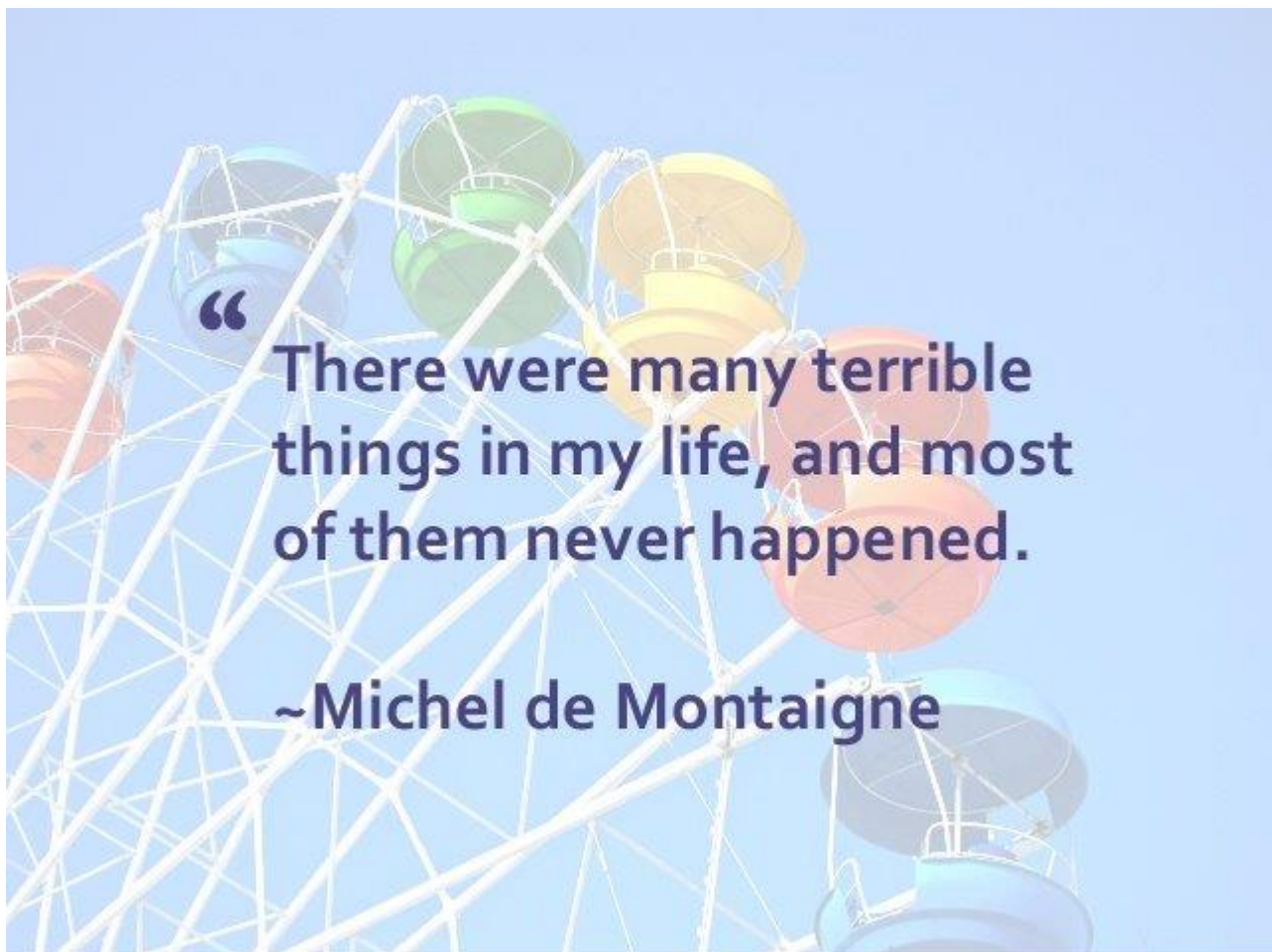
