Give a thought to those who have taught you some of the most important lessons in your life. Who and what are they?

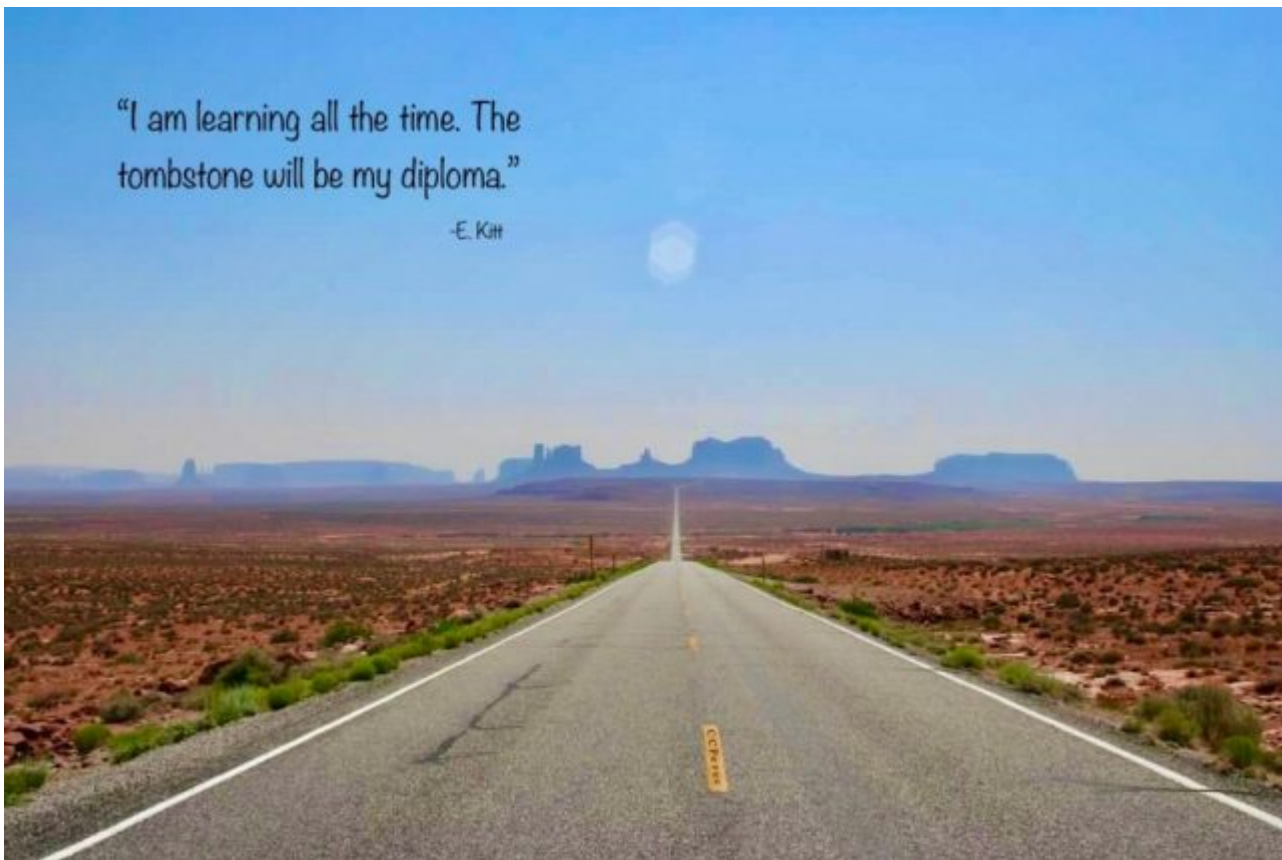
